Here is a list of the possible, common side effects of taking Magic Mushrooms, Cocaine, Ecstasy, Alcohol and Cannabis.



**Magic mushrooms | Common Side Effects:** Nausea, yawning, feeling drowsy, introspective experience, nervousness, paranoia, panic, hallucinations, and psychosis



Cocaine | Common Side Effects: Heart Disease (heart attacks and other problems are common among long-term cocaine users), Hypertension, Respiratory Problems, Infectious Diseases (when injected, it can lead to ulcers, gangrene, vein collapse, and infectious diseases such as HIV and hepatitis), Mental Illness (Cocaine addicts are very susceptible to clinical depression, anxiety, paranoia and schizophrenia, panic attacks, and more).



**Ecstasy | Common Side Effects:** Insomnia, confusion, irritability, anxiety, and depression, impulsiveness and aggression, decreased interest in sex, memory and attention problems,reduced appetite. People using Ecstasy (MDMA) could also unwittingly be using ephedrine, ketamine, caffeine, cocaine & methamphetamine.




**Alcohol | Common Side Effects:** High blood pressure, stroke, pancreatitis, liver disease, liver cancer, mouth cancer, head and neck cancer, breast cancer, bowel cancer, depression, dementia, sexual problems, such as impotence or premature ejaculation, infertility



**Cannabis | Common Side Effects:** Short-term memory problems, anxiety, strange behavior, psychosis, panic-attacks, hallucinations, lowered reaction time, increased heart rate, increased risk of stroke, problems with coordination, sexual problems (for males), decline in IQ

Substance	Class	Punishment 👸
Alcohol	N/A	N/A - It's against the law for anyone under 18 to buy alcohol in a pub, off-licence or supermarket or online.  Anyone over 18 can buy and drink alcohol legally in licensed premises in Britain. But, a lot of shops operate a scheme called Challenge 21 where if you look under 21 (or 25 in some places) and don't have proof of your age they will refuse to sell you alcohol.
		The police have the power to stop a person and confiscate alcohol in a public place if they reasonably suspect the person to be aged under 18. Young people under 18 who persistently drink or are found possessing alcohol in public places may be prosecuted.
Heroin	A	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 7 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and a fine.
Cocaine	A	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 7 years' imprisonment and a fine. Supply or production carries a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and a fine.
Cannabis	В	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Amphetamines (including dexamphetamine)	В	Possession of class B drugs carries a maximum sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry maximum sentences of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Anabolic steroids	В	Unauthorised supply or production is an offence and carries a maximum of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.

Substance	Class	Punishment 🍑
Amphetamines (including dexamphetamine)	В	Possession of class B drugs carries a maximum sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry maximum sentences of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Anabolic steroids	В	Unauthorised supply or production is an offence and carries a maximum of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Codeine	В	Illegal possession carries a maximum sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Ecstasy	A	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 7 years' imprisonment and/a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and a fine.
GHB	С	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 2 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Hallucinogenic mushrooms (containing psilocin)	A	Possession carries a maximum of 7 years imprisonment and/or fine. Supply of mushrooms carries a maximum of life imprisonment and/or fine.
		No offence is committed if the fungus is growing naturally without being cultivated, and if it has not been picked.
Heroin (diamorphine)	A	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 7 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and a fine.
Khat	С	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 2 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Ketamine	В	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and/or fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of 14 years' imprisonment and a fin

Substance	Class	Punishment 🗳
LSD	A	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 7 years' imprisonment and a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and a fine.
Mephedrone	В	Possession of the drug could result in up to 5 years' imprisonment and a fine, supply offences in up to 14 years' imprisonment and a fine.
Opium	A	Possession carries a maximum sentence of 7 years' imprisonment and/a fine. Trafficking offences carry a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and a fine.
Solvents & gases	N/A	N/A
Synthetic Cannabinoids - Legal Highs (including Spice and K2)	В	Possession of Class B drugs carry a maximum sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and a fine. Possession with intent to supply, trafficking offences and production of Class B drugs carry a maximum sentence of 14 years imprisonment and a fine.








**www.talktofrank.com** is the longest running anti-drugs campaign the UK established by the Department of Health and the Home Office of the British government in 2003.
